Jerry and Stacy Kramer have been serving God in northern Iraq on and off for the last eight years. They have been sharing their faith with the local people, whilst also serving individuals in several of the refugee camps that are in Kurdistan.

These refugee camps are mainly for Syrian Kurds and Yazidis, fleeing national and local conflicts. Currently there is a lot of need in the camps due to several factors: winter is approaching, the United Nations and non-governmental organisations have been reducing their funding, and there is a possibility of a new refugee crisis. This last issue is due to both Turkey and Iran considering military operations in the region.



Love for the least (Jerry and Stacy's ministry organisation) is currently looking into assisting the camps by supplying kerosene, heaters, possibly boilers, and food packages. Many of the refugees are living in tents or simple brick houses, and winter brings intensely cold weather. They are planning this whilst also continuing their programmes of teaching children the local language (that their school curriculum has been changed to), running school support classes, and organising a camp cleaning project.

It was a privilege to visit them recently and see how God is clearly at work in the region.
